



## GENERAL INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS TRAILER HITCH LIGHT

### Installation Notes:

1. Please read all instructions before installing.
2. The following procedure describes a generic (typical) installation.
3. Prior to installation check all parts and inspect for damage and/or cracks
4. Lighting laws vary depending on the jurisdiction, check your local laws before installation.
5. Consult your local mechanic or technician if uncertain of wiring or installation.

### Installation

1. Locate a sufficient 12v and ground source on your vehicle (The battery is a good source as the product has an on/off switch)
2. Tie wires up under vehicle and out of the way of any moving parts
3. Slide the hitch light onto your trailer hitch.
4. Slide the trailer hitch and light into the receiver under your vehicle
5. Plug the harness coming from the light into the harness tied to your 12v and ground source
6. Turn the switch on to check for proper function

**Figure 1** shows a hitch with a angled end. If this is the style hitch you have be sure to insert the longest part first or the Hitch Light will not slide onto the hitch.
